

## Cherry/Grape Tomatoes



**Lemon Drop** – everyone's favorite! Yellow sweet-tart cherry tomatoes are great for snacking and salads. These are early and very productive plants. Two of our customers have reported harvesting over 1000 of these tomatoes in one season!

\*. Indeterminate, 80-90 days from transplant.

**Pearly Pink Cherry** – Crisp, flavorful cherry tomatoes that are bright pink and perfect for snacking. The vines produce very well.



**Beams Yellow Pear** – interesting yellow pear shaped tomatoes are 1.5" long. Very cute and great for salads! Very productive.

\*Most productive when planted in the ground, but can be grown in large pots and hanging baskets. Indeterminate, 70-80 days from transplant.

**Black Cherry** – NEW for fall '09, these productive plants produced rich, sweet dusky purple cherry tomatoes. Seems to be a strong plant with nice, unusual fruit.



**Chadwick Cherry** – Another NEW and vigorous, sweet, cherry that is also disease resistant and hardy. A good size cherry tomato that can be used for snacking, salads and even sliced.

## Medium Tomatoes



**Cream Sausage** – cream to yellow oblong fruit, 2-3 inches long, bush like (determinate), so staking not required. They do well in pots or in the ground. These meaty tomatoes have a sweet mild flavor. Try making a cream colored salsa or sauce! 80-90 days from transplant.

**Purple Russian** – Ukrainian heirloom produces very tasty purple-pink, egg-shaped fruit with few blemishes. Fruit weigh about 6 oz.



**German Red Strawberry** – These 1 pound red fruits have the same shape as a strawberry! Sweet flesh is low on juice and seeds, making them great for slicing or sauce. Very nice!

**Cherokee Purple** – Very sweet and juicy 12oz fruit are rose to purple in color, often with green tops. Hardy and productive! 80 days from transplant.





**Bloody Butcher** – Golf ball size dark red fruit are juicy and tasty. Full bodied flavor! Plants are more compact than other varieties.

**Hillbilly Potato Leaf** – Pretty orange/red tomatoes grow 4-6" and are great for slicing. Potato leaf type foliage (like brandywine) is more disease resistant. Good producer. 85 days from transplant.



**Mule Team** – a red round tomato that weighs 8 – 12 oz. Fruit are sweet; great flavor, and produce over an extended amount of time! Great for slicing or topping your pizza! Disease resistant and productive. \* Indeterminate. 80-90 days from transplant.

**Moneymaker** – Another NEW offering, we just liked the name! Very productive. An old English heirloom; greenhouse variety; produces 4-6 oz globes that are intensely red, smooth and of very high quality. This variety grows well in hot humid climates and greenhouses, sets in most any weather.



Russian origin. This short potato leaf plant yields prolific quantities of 6 oz. fruit that looks like a beautiful mahogany-colored Bartlett pear with greenish shoulders. Very tasty flesh with a meaty core with flavor that is outstanding, rich and delicious, and the plants are very productive.

## Large Tomatoes



**Brandywine, Yellow** – yellow beefsteak tomato with sweet, tangy flavor. Fruit may have some cracking. The plants are large and will require staking. Excellent producer with great flavor! Plants require staking. Indeterminate, 76 days from transplant.

**Brandywine, Red** – large (10-12oz) red-pink round fruit with excellent tomato flavor! Great for slicing, salads and sandwiches. Plants require staking. Indeterminate, 70-80 days from transplant.



**Brandywine, Black** – The fruit is not so much black as deep orange to maroon, and not perfectly round, but they have been one of the most productive varieties when others have failed. Slightly sweet juicy flesh with famous brandywine taste. 80 - 90 days from transplant.



**Rose** – this Amish heirloom is a reliable producer of large meaty rose colored fruits that have great flavor and are produced on sturdy plants. Very pretty color. 75-80 days from transplant.



**Mortgage Lifter** - these huge red fruits can weigh up to 4lbs each (in ideal conditions, typically closer to 1-2lbs). These are productive and disease resistant plants. They will require staking. Meaty and full flavor with few seeds.



**Amish Paste** – Amish heirloom discovered in Wisconsin. Great producer of large paste tomatoes. Excellent for sauces. Tomatoes are oxheart to plum shape and very meaty. Plants will require staking. Indeterminate, 85 days from transplant.

**Floradade** – You know this one have to be good when it was continuously and singly sought out by the birds. Developed by UF in Dade County to hold up in our conditions.



**Atkinson** - Bred for Southern conditions, this medium-height variety produces 8-oz red globes even through hot, dry summers. A tomato with considerable merit, nice red flesh with good flavor.

**Pink Grapefruit** - A really unique tomato of medium size. Beautiful yellow fruit are blushing pink inside (hence their name). They have sweet-tart taste that does have citrus overtones. A productive, round tomato that is a winner.
